Guidelines for the analysis of JS Bach's Inventions

Students will no longer be required to do part-writing but will be required to analyse some of JS Bach's Two-Part Inventions.

When doing the analysis, students should be able to identify:

- the motive
- the countermotive
- the keys
- imitation
- developmental devices such as augmentation, diminution, inversion (contrary motion), retrograde, stretto etc.

They should also be familiar with the concept *invertible counterpoint*.

Students are advised to study the chapter on two-part inventions from the following source:
