

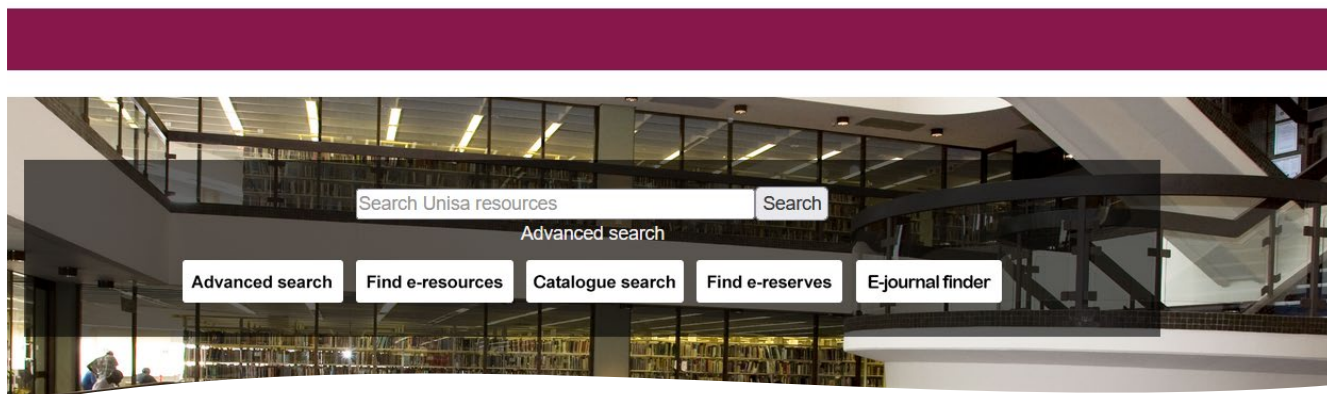
Searching using the Summon discovery tool

1. Accessing Summon discovery

There are two ways to access Summon:

1.1 Go to the library web page at <https://www.unisa.ac.za/sites/corporate/default/Library>

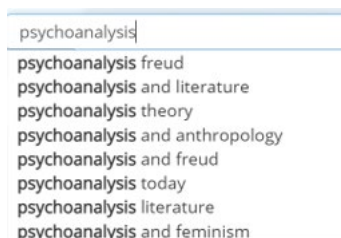
1.1.1 Enter your search terms in the Summon search box indicated with **Search Unisa resources** and click Search:



1.1.2 From the library web page, click the Catalogue search button- see the above screenshot.

1.1.2.1 On the catalogue web page, enter your search terms in the Summon search box indicated with **Search Unisa resources** and click Search.

When entering the search terms in the search box, a list of search terms will be given:

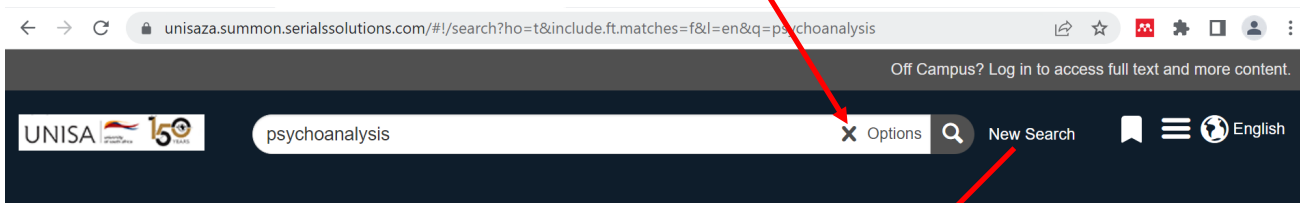


You can choose one of the listed search terms and then click Search. Or you can press Enter on the keyboard to use your own search term/s.

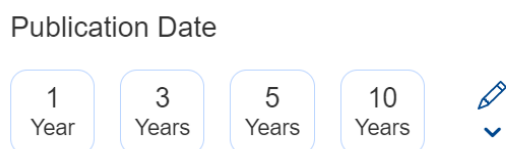
